



November meeting



Approval of minutes of the meeting held on the 1st October.

Planning Matters – None

07/25/00027: Variation of condition 2 of planning permission 07/24/00008 (Erection of extension to East Elevation, erection of extension to West Elevation on site of existing conservatory (to be demolished) and erection of terrace and steps into rear garden to amend the approved plans in schedule A, at 157, Brent Street, Brent Knoll, TA9 4BE.

Response: The Parish Council supported this proposal on the grounds of property enhancement in keeping with surrounding street scene.

Financial Matters Agreed

- (a) Statutory Payments List: Approved by Members for 2025/2026.
- (b) Variable payments List: Approved by members at this meeting.
- (c) Village Contract 2026/2029 resolution to appoint JP Mayo.
- (d) Toilet Cleaning Contract 2026/2029 resolution to approve Incleanz.
- (e) Initial consideration of 2026/2027 Budget further in December.

Play Area

Play surface and other matters within the play area. A decision was taken to replace the safer surface under the Climbing Frame at the lower cost of £5323 including VAT, this decision is subject to the Council achieving some contributions from grants. Also, replacement of the Abacus on the climbing frame £546.86 including VAT and replacing a metal panel on the MUGA in the sum of £1172.40 including VAT the work to be carried out by GB Sports. Agreed unanimously.

The award of 1st Prize in the Somerset Small Playing Field of the Year was welcomed by members of the council.

- (b) To Replace the Council Laptop at a cost of £584.
- (c) New secure Council Domain using the '.gov.uk' protocols.



Not going Home for Christmas!

We always try to get our casualties home for Christmas if we can. Sometimes their injuries make that impossible and we then try to give them an extra tasty meal. We at least know that they are snug and warm even in the coldest of nights. Our staff and volunteers work all through the Christmas period to ensure that there is help if needed.

Sometimes we find that wildlife hasn't read the book (!), and things arrive in the wrong season. A mallard duck once produced six lovely yellow ducklings in the middle of December when it was snowing! She then deserted them, but we were able to rear them with an incubator and keep them indoors until the spring came.



In December, a few years ago a vet in Italy got in touch with me as he had a female badger in care with a broken back leg. This he had fixed but he was finding that she was sleeping for long periods and only eating every few days. I explained that as they had delayed implantation, females go into a deep sleep in the winter which allows the embryos to attach and start to grow. Gestation is 7 weeks and 1 day. I therefore said that it was best to leave her to eat when she felt like it and let nature take its course. A very happy vet contacted me a few weeks later, a very proud 'dad' of two cubs and the leg had healed beautifully.



We always look at December as being the end of a year, but many animals have started to think about breeding. Going into January, you will be hearing the foxes starting to call for mates. Tawny and Barn Owls may already be thinking of nesting sites for their next brood.

Even in the short winter days, I seem to find things to do out in the garden just for a few hours. I know I will soon be accompanied by my robin who is always keen to see

what I am turning over in case the odd worm or millipedes are uprooted. They are the only birds that continue to sing in the winter to protect their territory. Wrapped up warm, it's a good time to walk over to our Millennium Wood to look out for the signs of where the deer have been sleeping, the latrines that the badgers have used to mark their territory although not so active at this time of year. It's lovely to see the wildlife or their signs to show me how we share our fields with wildlife – and the dog enjoys a walk too. Then it's back into the warm and maybe a mug of mulled wine!

I hope you and your family have a lovely Christmas and send our good wishes from us all at Secret World Wildlife Rescue.



Brent Knoll House Histories – 103

Last month I noted the references to the poor in William Spearing's will, which were obtained from a modern transcript of a relevant part of the will. During November I decided to have a look at a seventeenth century copy of his will, dated July 1691, which still exists in the Axbridge Archive, now housed in the South West Heritage Centre Record Office, just outside Taunton (I assume William Spearing's family retained the original). It was not quite what I had expected. Firstly, it was a rather large document, but also, it was not always very easy to read. Some of the reason for that is the fact that seventeenth century writing and spelling are not quite the same as they are now, to say the least. However, I can usually manage most of that, with a little careful analysis, but another reason, which is mentioned in a couple of documents which accompanied this copy of the will, made life a little bit more difficult.

Apparently, in 1851 this copy of his will was "*presented to the Mayor and Council of Axbridge. It was mounted, framed and hung in the Council Chamber of Axbridge Town Hall.*" It then states that there was a note, which had been glued to the rear of the board on which the document had been nailed (!), which was "*too fragile and fragmentary to be removed and preserved*" when the document was finally removed from its frame in 1974. It read, "*William Spearing, for many years of this Corporation, died in the year 1691,*" (though his monument says he died in 1690!) It then goes on, "*This document remained in Darkness for many years and was presented by Thomas Nicholls Esq', Town Clerk, who had possession of it for more than fifty years.*" I am not sure why he had possession of it, as it would appear to belong to the Corporation. Unfortunately, a number of documents over the years were lost because people "had them in their possession." It continues, presumably referencing Thomas Nicholls, "*A humble individual of this Corporation considered it unpardonable that the intentions of this good man should be laid down in silence, when so many poor of this Town is constantly relieved by his Bounty and extensive Charity, caused it to be placed in the Council Chamber by permission of William Maggs Esq', Mayor, and the rest of the Common Council, in the year 1851.*"


Thomas Nicholls was a Solicitor who lived in St Mary's Street, just behind the Oak House and is described in an 1840 Directory as, Town Clerk; Clerk of the Peace and Prothonotary (a chief clerk in a law court); Perpetual Commissioner for taking acknowledgements of married women (an interesting one, which acknowledged that a woman's property was not automatically taken over and owned by her husband on marriage, as it had previously been, and her right would be assessed independently from her husband, to ensure she agreed with any of his decisions about a sale); Commissioner of Queen's Bench, Common Pleas & Exchequer; Agent for the British Insurance Office & Westminster Insurance Office, for whom the London Agents were Messrs. Lawrence & Taylor, 25, Old Fish Street., Doctor's Commons . The first two of those were standard for the Town Clerk, but when a Royal Commission interviewed an Axbridge Town Clerk earlier in that century and asked him what it meant, he had no idea!


In 1851 there is also a Thomas Nicholls who is listed as a Capital Burgess. He lives at the top of the High Street opposite the former Methodist Church, which is now an Arts Centre. I assume he is probably the father of the Town Clerk, but he has an unusual feature in his signature, which always records the year in which he signs anything as shown here.

from light, damp and wood beetle was becoming very apparent, it was removed from its frame and placed for safekeeping among the Town Trust records", which is why there are parts of it which are unreadable today, particularly around the top and bottom edges.

William Spearing does start his will in the traditional way by stating, "In the name of God Amen, the tenth day of September in the fourth year of the reyne of our Soverayne Lorde..." But then this part gets very difficult to read, though it obviously would refer to King James the Second and list all his dominions, which would still have included France in those days, as well as the nations of the United Kingdom, including Ireland, which is the last one mentioned and the only one still visible.

William Spearing then goes on to say, "being in good health and of perfect memory, praised be God, yet considering the frailty of this mortall life, the uncertainty of the tyme and the certainty of death, and how often it falleth out that troubles and contentions doe arise after men's death concerning their temperall estates, for prevention whereof I have thought it requisite and necessary (a word is crossed out here and another has a tear through it, but I think it says, "to settle and dispose;") of my Estate which God hath given me in time of health, that soe it may be quietly enjoyed after my death by such person and persons as I am desirous should have and enjoy the same."

What was not mentioned in the bequest to the poor in last month's transcript is that the very first item he mentions in his disposal items is, "I give unto the poore of my parish of Axbridge in the County of Somersett fforty shillings to be distributed amongst them the day of my interment." Later he also gives ten shillings each to the Churchwardens and Overseers "as an acknowledgement for their paines in managing the said estate."

Bishop's letter - Christmas joy for all people

We fear that we live in a world of increasing polarisation. Conflicts between and within nations play their part. The amplification of division and hostility by social media algorithms doesn't help. Culture wars exacerbate matters further. Sometimes it feels like common ground is disappearing from underneath our feet like a sandbar being overwhelmed by the tide.



In such a climate, it's good to return to the message that heralded the arrival of Jesus. 



May the joy of the angels, the peace of the shepherds and the hope of the Magi be with you and your loved ones this Christmas and in the year ahead.



Nature Diary December – Looking back over the year

Looking back on 2025 the outstanding feature was the contrast in weather patterns. In January we were having to cope with floods after torrential rainfall around the turn of the year. We then went into a very dry period in spring. Summer began as normal in June but July and August produced heatwave after heatwave and one of the driest summers on record. As I write this Diary we are back into “average” conditions, but, despite significant rain, none of the springs around the Knoll has yet to produce any water flow. When we recently visited Cheddar Reservoir at least a quarter of the area was dry. I am sure that this will change with the coming winter, but we will need more than average rainfall to replenish the reservoir levels for 2026.


As expected, the weather affected plant growth. The wet winter meant that the primroses in St Michael’s churchyard were at their best, with a wonderful display on the path to the lychgate. Primroses thrive under cool and damp conditions, so let us hope that the dry summer has not affected them too much. Grasses died back in July after setting seed in the usual way. The fact that grasses have started to grow again demonstrates the remarkable feature of this class of plant. One of their survival mechanisms is to “shut down” when water is scarce and to start growing again when the drought ends. On our trips to Botswana over the past twenty years we have seen both dry and wet seasons. Sub-Saharan ecosystems have adapted to this variation in water supply and major animal migrations such as that of the wildebeest have resulted. The leaves on woody plants in southern Africa also have waxy leaves to cut down water loss, but in the dry season they do drop their leaves as deciduous plants in Europe do in winter. This has happened with local shrubs in Brent Knoll, but another effect of our drought has been for woody plants such as shrubs and trees to over-produce flowers and berries. In the first week of November the hawthorn that grows in one of the driest parts of the churchyard was in full bloom. Firethorn (pyracantha) has yellow and red varieties. At St Michael’s we have a yellow variety that was heavily weighted with berries this autumn and on Brent Street I have noticed a number of fiery red firethorn hedges. Come Christmas and all these berries will have been stripped from the bushes by thrushes and blackbirds.

Following the poor showing of many butterflies in 2024, what happened in 2025? The short answer is that 2025 was a much better year. However, there were some interesting variations on what might have been expected. White butterflies were relatively scarce at the beginning of the season, but large whites, in particular, had a better second half of the season. I noticed this on my veg plot. In the early part of the year brassicas that I planted thrived. Unfortunately, I failed to net them in mid to late summer and my efforts to control the caterpillars in July and August failed miserably. The brussels sprouts and purple sprouting broccoli plants are now skeletons! Common blues were seen in good numbers this year. Normally I know where they will be seen in specific sections of the butterfly walk, with a particular stronghold being the top of the Knoll. It is unusual for their numbers to exceed 10-12 on a single walk. However, on one occasion I counted 30 on my climb up the Knoll. The odd thing was that the count the following week was zero for that section. Where had the other common blues gone in the meantime? Other highlights of the year were good numbers of wall browns early in the season, and a clouded yellow. This is only the second time in 17 years that I have ever seen a clouded yellow. Other transect walkers in Somerset report them regularly every year but Brent Knoll seems to miss out.

Finally, our Church swallows did not reappear in 2025. It would seem that the death of one partner in 2024 has, indeed, been fatal, as I suspected it might be. Ged

Update from Tessa Munt, MP for Brent Knoll

Last month, I spoke in Parliamentary debates on various subjects - from Sudan to Business Rates, the new 'Hillsborough Law' to the Infected Blood scandal and prison sentences to Powers of Attorney.

October marked Breast Cancer Awareness Month and I gladly attended a Macmillan Coffee Morning in Parliament and the Breast Cancer Now's 'Wear It Pink!' event. It's good to know progress has been made, awareness raised and I know the Prostate Cancer UK campaigns are equally important annual events in Parliament too.



I've criss-crossed the constituency visiting schools and businesses, harvesting organic walnuts (!), attending meetings, events and surgeries.

I was honoured to join the families of those who died in a Chinook helicopter crash in the Mull of Kintyre in June 1994, delivering a petition to 10 Downing Street. 31 years later, the families, one of whom is local, still have no idea what happened. They're calling for the Defence Secretary to meet them, release the documents – now locked away for 100 years – and tell the truth about what happened that day. I'll work to make progress and bring justice to the families involved.

November is a more sombre month, with remembrance at its core. 2025 saw Parliament mark 75 years since the House of Commons chamber was rebuilt after being bombed in 1941. Our communities honour those who lost their lives, particularly in the Great War and the Second World War. Every year I wear both a red and a white poppy. The red poppy reminds us "never forget" the loss of British military personnel and the allied forces who died alongside them. The plea of the white 'peace' poppy - first worn in 1933 - is "never again". We remember everyone who died, those physically and mentally injured, made homeless or stateless by war. Civilians are victims of war too, as our daily news broadcasts constantly remind us.

Brent Knoll Weather Report – October 2025

October got off to a quiet start, with hazy sunshine and a mild south-easterly breeze on the 1st and rather more cloud on the 2nd. This was the lull before the storm, because in the western Atlantic things were far from quiet thanks to hurricanes Humberto and Imelda. One product of the complex weather situation off the east coast of America was Storm Amy, which formed in mid-Atlantic on 2nd October.



A powerful jet stream carried Amy to the west of Ireland on the 3rd and the north of Scotland on the 4th, with the low deepening all the way – the lowest pressure recorded was 947.9hPa at Shetland, a new October record for the UK. Amy caused severe damage and disruption in Ireland and the north of the UK, with some fatalities. The effects were felt here as rain during the afternoon of the 3rd as the warm front passed through, followed by more rain on the cold front later in the evening as the breeze veered west and freshened. Overnight wind speeds increased further, with gusts of over 40kts from early morning until mid-afternoon on the 4th and it wasn't until the evening of the 5th that things quietened down as Amy moved off east into the Baltic.

The 6th and 7th brought a complete contrast with sunshine and a light north-westerly breeze, thanks to a brief ridge of high pressure. The 8th was a day of cloud and drizzle, but on the 9th an area of high pressure moved up from the Azores to cover the whole of the UK. This high stayed with us for a week or so, but as sometimes happens during the cooler months it had a good deal of cloud trapped beneath it, without enough strength in the sun to burn it off. Hence instead of blue sky and sunshine, this high pressure brought us a spell of anti-cyclonic gloom with the sky full of featureless grey stratus.

There were a few breaks in the cloud. A clear night on the 11th/12th produced the lowest temperature of the month, with 2.7C recorded around dawn. On a couple of evenings, the cloud broke up shortly before sunset and we were treated to colourful sun dogs caused by hexagonal ice crystals in the atmosphere.

The high pressure slipped away east on the 18th and the first of a series of Atlantic lows moved in the following day, bringing showers and yet more cloud. During this period Comet Lemmon (C/2025 A6 (LEMMON) to give it its official title) was reaching its closest approach to Earth and I was beginning to despair of getting a glimpse of it. Fortunately, there was a break in the cloud on the evening of the 21st, the day of the closest approach and I was able to get a clear view with binoculars. Those with younger eyes and dark skies might have seen it unaided.

The procession of Atlantic lows continued for the rest of the month, including Storm Benjamin which moved quickly up the English Channel overnight on the 22nd/23rd. This low brought flooding and gales to the Channel Islands and western France and the south-east of England also suffered some disruption. The wettest day of the month here was the 24th which was a day of sunshine and showers totalling 12.2mm. We managed some hazy sunshine on the 25th, but in general the end of the month was dull and wet.

The rainfall total for October was 62.8mm, below average but within the normal range. Unfortunately, Bristol Water's monitoring site was rather out of date at the time of writing, with Cheddar reservoir still showing only 30%, but no doubt October's rainfall will have helped to improve that figure. The average temperature for October was also about what we would expect, at 12.8C. Perhaps the most notable feature of October was the absence of sunshine, not helped by cloud trapped under the high pressure in the middle of the month.

Live Events at the Cinema – Tosca

Wednesday, October 1st saw my friend Denise and I back at the Ritz cinema in Burnham, to see and hear this wonderful opera which is full of tragic events.

The story is that the local (Rome) police chief, **Scarpia**, a very nasty piece of work, is searching for an escaped prisoner and thinks that **Caravadossi**, an artist, has helped said prisoner to hide. This is exactly what Caravadossi has done and is taken off from his painting in the church to Scarpia's torture room. He will not divulge the whereabouts, however, despite horrible things happening to him. Meantime, his lover, singer **Floria Tosca** has followed him to Scarpia's house and is made to listen to the torture, while Scarpia makes promises that if she will yield to his desires, he will spare the painter. Scarpia himself sits listening to the painter's cries and drinking wine, while Tosca pleads with him. Eventually, she can bear it no longer and agrees to his demands (I leave you to guess what those are!). Scarpia says he will arrange a fake execution for Caravadossi, as he has to keep up appearances with his underlings. In reality, he arranges that the execution is real, but Tosca will not know this until after she has given him what he wants.

Tosca, in Scarpia's house, finds herself unable to do what he asks and on finding a weapon to hand, kills him. She then goes to tell Caravadossi what he must do, i.e. when "shot" lie still as if dead until the officers have gone away and they will then get a safe passage out of the country. She then finds that Scarpia has double-crossed her and her lover is dead, so throws herself out of the window.

The 2 main characters were sung and acted superbly by **Freddie de Tommaso** and **Anna Netrebko**, whose tenor and soprano voices blended beautifully in the duets and arias they sung. **Gerald Finlay**, singing the part of Scarpia, had a very powerful bass voice and used it to good effect, enjoying the suffering of both the lovers.

The Opera House has a new director in **Oliver Mears** and a new musical director in **Jakub Hrusa** and this was a version set in the modern era, with up to date costumes by **Ilonka Karas** (Tosca's dresses were stunning). The sets - the church in Act 1; Scarpia's house in Act 2; the ramparts of **Castel Sant'angelo** in Act 3, all designed by Simon Holdsworth were simple but very effective. The orchestra, as ever, were brilliant, they don't always get the recognition they deserve, as they work very hard, whether opera or ballet, but never let us down.

All in all, a great start to the season and we look forward to the next offering.
