Notes from the Parish Council

January meeting



Approval of minutes of the meeting held on the 7th January.

Planning Matters – None

Individual grant from the Brent Knoll Charities account to members of the local guiding group.

- (d) A precept for 2026/2027 of **£69,966** was set and approved unanimously which represents an increase of **2.89%** over the current year.

National Grid improvement and Substation

The details for this proposal from the National Grid were identified on the December minutes and the National Grid will site a substation on a small piece of land just inside the village green perimeter with close access to the car park. It will be protected a close board fencing and the National Grid will require access to the substation. All costs of the legal transfer of land will be met by the National Grid and the Parish Council receive the added advantage of new white lining for the car park and the substation will be capable of upgrading to electric charging points in the future. The land on which the substation is to be erected will be transferred together with full access rights in the sum of £1 nominal fee. This project will now be the subject of both the legal process and arboricultural survey by National Grid. It was further requested that an agreement be reached for the ongoing maintenance of the feather boarding surround to the substation.

Other Key Decisions taken by the Parish Council

- (a) Development of a new website to comply fully with current legislation.
- (b) Hills to Levels improvement scheme - Significant progress has now been made in moving this project forward in 2026. Grant funding has been agreed in the sum of £4132 with no cost to the Parish Council for this part of the project. Declarations and Mandates for grant receipts are now ready for submission. The Parish Council formally agreed by a unanimous resolution to go ahead with the process. The Clerk to submit the appropriate signed paperwork

Brent Knoll's Community Shop News

Brent Knoll Community Shop began 2025 with just £6,000 in cash reserves, having paid more than £66,000 on all the costs for fitting out the new shop. It ended the year with more than £34,000 in reserves, thanks to having attracted more customers, more volunteers and stronger sales.

Since moving into the new shop, monthly sales have increased by up to 20%. This strong trading, coupled with successful grant applications and profitable events, has enabled the shop to provide support for a number of community partners and initiatives. The latest example is a request for donated refreshments in support of an F1 school competition team.

Meanwhile there have been further improvements to the new shop, with investments to resolve the problem we had with the entrance mat, to provide our coffee machine with a mains-water supply and to increase the number of CCTV cameras.

Upcoming events are also in the diary. The next "Sausage Sizzler" will be on Saturday 28th February from 10am to 12 noon in the Parish Hall, while the next Quiz Night will be on 7th March, also in the Parish Hall. A wine-tasting evening is also planned for the Spring and the shop will be the beneficiary of an evening event at The Ritz in Burnham-on-Sea on 21st September.

Our diary also includes a number of events with our sponsoring body, The Plunkett Foundation. These include a training day for South West Community Shops at Powderham Castle in February, the next meeting of the Somerset Community Shops Group in March and an on-line seminar on controlling electricity costs. *David Sturgess*

It was with deep regret that I heard of the recent death of Tony Hill. He had supported me during the numerous Projects that I had undertaken covering items in the Village.

One in particular was the conservation of the only Chest Tomb in the Churchyard.

When I was at the point of giving up on the project due to the number of disappointments, it was Tony who persuaded me to keep going with the project.

Also, when I was researching Brent Knoll, he told me the following story.

When he travelled by train from Brent Knoll station to work, he could hear the train leaving Highbidge station and this would give him just time to cycle to the station and catch the train.

However, cutting it this fine, on one occasion when he arrived, the train was just about to leave. So, he got down from the platform, crossed the rails and got onto the train.

He needed to do this as there was no footbridge connecting the two platforms. To get from one platform to another you had to walk back to Station Road, cross over the railway bridge and then walk up to the station approach.

Of course, this would not be allowed today due to Health and Safety regulations. However, he said at that time the station staff were very helpful.

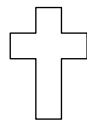

Against all odds

In February a few years ago, we had an urgent call from a couple in Bristol. It was 1am on a very cold night. A distressed young man told me about a badger that was in the river next to the S.S. Great Britain in Bristol. "He's making a terrible noise crying for help," he said. I felt useless as we don't have any volunteers in Bristol at that time of night, nor could I ignore the situation. I explained that I would attend but that it would be nearly an hour before I could get there. "Please do try," the young man pleaded so I gave him my mobile number and asked him to let me know if the situation changed. I then rang my son, Simon, who lives next door to go with me and despite getting dressed very quickly, it was at least 15 minutes before we could de-ice the car and collect the cage and catching equipment.

Halfway on our journey there, the young man rang to say that the badger had hauled itself on to a tyre between a barge and the harbour wall. They were both going to stay to meet us when we got there which was nearly 2.30am by the time we arrived. They were both sitting near to where the badger was with a blanket around themselves to keep warm. Simon tried to get the badger with a net but as it was an 8ft drop to the tyre, he sadly missed and the badger dropped into the water. He swam past the barge and looked as if he was going to swim out to the middle of the river, but he turned and came alongside the barge. The effort of swimming and being cold meant he was making a lot of noise and we were hoping the noise wouldn't stop as it would mean he had drowned. By this time Simon was ready with the grasper, leaning over as much as he could with the young man and I holding on to his legs. Amazingly he caught the badger and it took all of us to pull Simon and the badger up on to the wall, quickly putting the badger in the cage. The couple were overjoyed and we were so pleased to have the badger and ourselves soon in a nice warm car travelling home. Placed overnight in our badger pen, she (as we found out) was soon asleep under a heat lamp. Checked out the next day by the vet, her lungs were clear and after a few days of hotel food, she was ready to go home – but where to as we really didn't know where she fell in.



Having looked at Google, we found a few areas near the harbour that seemed to be a possibility so by going back into Bristol at 3am for it to be as quiet as possible, we went to have a look. Badgers are territorial and it really is important that they get back to their own group otherwise they will fight. Luckily the first place we looked at had several badger paths, so fingers crossed we carried the cage to the area. Immediately the sow roused and desperately clawed at the cage to get out. Opening the cage, she immediately followed one of the paths – she was home!

Sometimes our rescues seem impossible, but this one was a very happy ending.

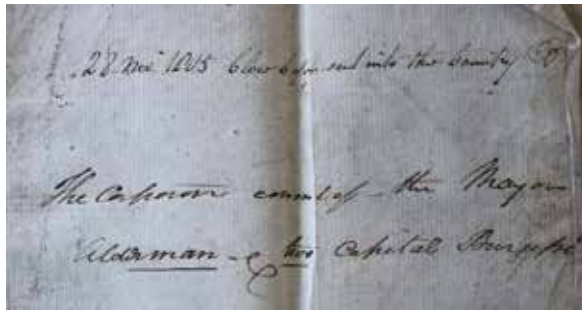

Brent Knoll House Histories – 105

Notably the signatures at the end of last month's document, showing the audited accounts of the Spearing Charity properties in Brent Knoll, East Brent and Mark, include Gabriel Stone, who was the owner of Somerset Court, so would be fairly familiar with the properties not that far from his home.

This month, however, I am looking at the court case in Chancery between the Attorney

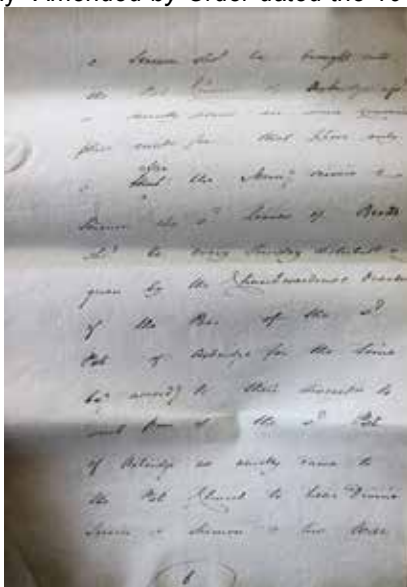


General and the Axbridge Corporation in 1805, in which George Symons, who is labelled an Esquire, Richard Cox, is a gentleman and John Crease, a carrier, (although Axbridge documents refer to him as a currier - someone who prepares leather) all, at one time or another, Burgesses (Symons being a Capital Burgess at this

time, whilst the other two are Moorwardens in 1804 – officers who monitor the use of the moorland within the parish of Axbridge), accuse the late Mayor, John Tucker, and various others, of causing a loss of income amounting to £50 (quite a lot of money then, going into multiple thousands of pounds today, though differing sites quote very different comparisons). This would, of course, be of considerable detriment to the poor of the parish.

Last month the date was stated to be 1792, which is the date listed in the Record Office calendar, but there does seem to be some confusion, as this document clearly states 1805 and John Tucker, for instance, was the Mayor, as stated in the document, in that year. At the top of the main text it does say “Amended by Order dated the 10th day of August 1805” and the cover dates it as the 28th November in the same year. I assume the August date is when the amendment was ordered and the November date was when the document was eventually completed.

I have been able to transcribe the document which, in the original runs to forty-one pages, so I will not be repeating it all here! As it happens, that is not the only reason for summarising the document, as the original includes many long titles naming the parties involved, which are invariably printed in full whenever they are needed, some extensive repetition of items from Spearing's original will, lots of margins, spaces between the lines and between the words and often tricky abbreviations. The spaces are supposed to be in case they need to annotate anything and are fairly regular in similar documents at that time.

The parties involved are, for instance, *“the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said Parish of Axbridge,”* often supplemented with, *“for the time being,”* whilst the Council is invariably alluded to as, *“the Mayor, Alderman and Burgesses of the said Borough of Axbridge,”* often supplemented with, *“and their successors.”*

There are also many abbreviations, which can be a bit tricky. “s^d” is obviously “said,” and it is said very, very often! “afsd” is “aforesaid,” “shod” is “should,” “thof” is “thereof” and “pson or psons” obviously “person or persons.” Perhaps a little less obvious is “or” which is “other” and “Premes,” which means “Premises.”

After explaining the terms of William Spearing’s will in considerable detail it then mentions that Thomas Lovell and Jno Tuthill, who administered the estate when Spearing died, were now dead themselves. As that was well over one hundred years ago that is not too surprising. What turns out to be a problem, though, is that the Churchwardens, Overseers of the Poor and Axbridge Council were responsible for distributing the proceeds, but the administrators of the estate continued to be Lovell and Tuthill. As Lovell died first, the estate became the responsibility of the remaining trustee, Jno Tuthill and on his death, his Heirs and assigns. Unfortunately, by the time of this court case nobody appears to know who Tuthill’s heirs are which means that there was considerable difficulty at law in being able to recover possession of the premises involved. One of the things requested by those bringing this case (the accusers) is that the defendants should find out who is the heir, by following his family tree and where he or she lives, so that they can handle the administration of the estate legally. If not, then they request that, in the meantime, the estate may be handled to the greatest advantage by *“this Honourable Court.”* After all, Spearing’s will did say that it should be handled to the most advantage and for the most money that can be reasonably got for the properties.

All this has meant that the value of the estate had previously been treated as though it remained at a value which was now considerably out-of-date. Apparently, there was an attempt by the Overseers, on the 29th of September 1803 to give written notice to Jno Lancaster, the then current lessee of the properties, siting termination of the lease on the 25th day of March the following year. They then advertised the lease for sale, but not all the Overseers took part and no survey of the properties was conducted to ascertain its true value. At the sale someone called George Dibble did offer as much as £120..5s..0d p.a. for the rent of the properties. This turns out to be about £50 or so above the rent which Lancaster was currently paying, but none of the Churchwardens or Overseers appear to have attempted to evict Lancaster and he seems to have refused both to leave the premises or to increase the rental he paid. The accusers suggest that *“Jno Lancaster, the occupier of the said Premises may be charged with the Rent for which the said Premises might have been let had he delivered up possession thereof according to the said notice.”*

There is also a strong indication that the rents which had accumulated had not, until recent times, always been used for the purposes for which they were intended, i.e. as specific distributions to the poor and that nobody maintained any accounts, which should also have been properly audited. In fact, they were very sceptical about how the Churchwardens, Overseers and Burgesses had handled the charity for most of the time.

I sometimes wonder what would happen in the life of our churches if we could adopt the same outlook there? Each generation glad that the other is there. Each generation contributing something to the whole. Each generation looking to the interests of the others, making sure there was something that spoke to the others even if not to them.

Blister pack Recycling

Blister packs are not recyclable at the kerbside as they are generally a mixture of foil and plastic which are not possible to be recycled with other plastics (and sorting facilities cannot separate them from other plastics). We do see a few types that are made of foil only and these would be acceptable to place in the blue bag.

For blister packs to be recycled, they need to be collected separately and sent as a single stream to a specialised reprocessor such as Terracycle or MyGroup. Both Boots and Superdrug have schemes where people can take back their blister packs for recycling. [Two high street brands expand recycling schemes for medicine packaging - The Pharmaceutical Journal](#). It’s worth checking with the local store to see if they are taking part in the scheme.

Nature Diary for February – British Plants Since the Last Ice Age

Recently I gave a talk on how the flora of the British Isles has developed since the last Ice Age. In this, and the next Diary, I shall draw on this talk to outline how the British flora has developed over the past 9,000 years or so.

The ice began to melt about 9,000 years ago and the glaciers started to retreat. At that point Britain was geographically joined to Europe. An expanse of low, marshy land was exposed in what is now the North Sea. This is now known as Doggerland and plants, people and animals migrated across this land bridge. Around 6,500 years ago Doggerland was inundated by rising sea levels caused by glacial meltwater, leaving Britain isolated from continental Europe.

Botanists regard species that were in Britain before the land bridge was lost as **native** and those that arrived after as **non-native**. One cannot be precise, but the Botanical Society of Britain and Ireland reckon that, overall, there are 2,490 plant species in Britain. This is made up of 1,390 native species, leaving us with 1,100 species that have migrated to Britain by various means.

How do we know these numbers? Part of the answer lies in how we classify species of plants and last May's Diary dealt with the scientific classification introduced by the Swedish physician Linnaeus in the 18th century. But this ordering of natural species was preceded by significant fieldwork from English naturalists in the 17th century. In those days naturalists were generalists and their observations covered a wide range of natural subjects. They were "amateurs" in the sense that they were not paid for the studies that they undertook. In his book *The Naturalist in Britain* David Elliston Allen points out that their solitary excursions into the countryside could lead them into trouble - "For everywhere lurked thieves". As late as 1749 Horace Walpole lost his gold watch to two highwaymen armed with a blunderbuss in Hyde Park, near London. The wilder parts of the country were even more unsafe, partly because country people were suspicious that strangers wandering around peering at the ground were up to no good. In 1707 in Northumberland Dr Caleb Threlkeld was accused of being a spy "because I clambered up the rocks and kept not the high road". And when the idea of spies seemed too far-fetched, people were convinced that these strangers "were employed by the Parliament in order to raise further taxes". In 1760 Sir Joseph Banks, the botanist who accompanied Cooke on his Australian explorations, was "seized on suspicion of being a highwayman" and "hauled before Sir John Fielding at Bow St before the error was exposed".

Despite these social setbacks the 19th century saw an expansion in our knowledge of the underlying geology of the earth's crust and we began to understand geological timescales that operate over thousands and millions of years. Bishop Ussher's prediction that the world came into existence in 4004 BC was no longer believed. In the 20th century further scientific evidence from microscopic pollen analysis of core samples of soil led to discoveries about the plants that existed around the time that the glaciers were melting.

So, in summary science has put together much of the evidence on how Britain's flora has developed since the ice age. But humans have also played a part and in the next Diary, history will take centre stage when we will look at how humans have enriched our flora over the past 2,000 years or so.

Brent Knoll Feature – 61

In last month's BKN I noted that it was 100 years ago this year, in February, that the foundation stone of the Brent Knoll Parish Hall was laid by Miss Brain of Somerset Court. However, whilst delving into the building of the Hall a little more closely, I was reminded that what actually happened that month was the commencement of the building of the hall, but it was not until early September of that year that the foundation stone was laid. Mr W. P. Pechey, who lived in Sunnyslawn (shortly after renamed The Croft) and was the Chairman of the Executive Committee, explained at the laying of the stone, that *"it was the custom some years ago for a foundation stone to really be the foundation stone of the building, but they were following the procedure of the Romans, who used to commemorate a special occasion with a white stone."*

Exactly what that special occasion was is not entirely clear. A local builder, J.G. Steer & Sons, had his tender of £750 accepted for the building, which also appears to have included the design and had been working on it for most of the period from February. However, this was 1926, the year of the General Strike. Writing in the Deanery Magazine, the vicar, the Revd. A. C. Schofield, commented that, *"Delay...may be caused by the difficulty of obtaining bricks. Brickworks, alas, are being compelled to close down for lack of coal."* Some while later he added that, *"The building of our Parish Hall is held up."* He was not very complimentary about the background reasons for the strike.

As early as 1920 a committee had been set up to raise funds for the proposed Hall and succeeded in raising £85 in that year. A further £50 was raised the following year (that would be worth a few thousand pounds today), but no figure was given for 1922. In 1923 the vicar, the Revd. Gardner held a Fête at the vicarage, which raised £78. He also offered a plot of land for the Hall, which would have been fine if it were not for the fact that several conditions as to its use were imposed. These proved unacceptable to the Committee but, luckily, Alfred Bennis, who lived at that time in Ball Copse Hall, came to the rescue and purchased the plot, which he then gave to the Committee.

I assume that, as the vicar offered the plot he still remained the owner, although at that time it was part of the grounds of the *"old Bowling Club,"* which, I assume, means it was no longer in use as such, although some locals were certainly still playing, as the builder, J.G. Steer, for instance, is mentioned in bowls tournaments in Weston-super-Mare. The house now known as Norefields was the actual site of the bowling green itself and The Hollies was used as the Club House in the early 1920s.

Presumably it took some time to sort out the details of these exchanges for it was 1925 when a major fund-raising effort took place. Various people in the village offered subscriptions and £195 was collected by a self-appointed Committee. Additional sums of £80, from a Garden Fête at the vicarage and £60, from winter entertainments, followed by £76 from a Fête and a dance the following year, meant the total had reached £650. This was still £100 less than the tender and that was only the cost of the structure: things such as heating and lighting would be an extra cost. Nevertheless, it was felt that it was important to proceed with the building and that would probably assist fundraising during the ensuing year.

Brent Knoll Weather Report – December 2025

December turned out to be another mild and wet month, in fact it was the wettest December I have recorded. Two weather patterns dominated; up to the 21st there was high pressure to the east of the UK, slowing the progress of Atlantic lows. These slow-moving lows drew in a south-westerly or, later on, southerly tropical airflow. As well as keeping temperatures well above normal for the first three weeks of December, this air brought plenty of moisture which was deposited as rain.

On the afternoon of the 7th we recorded 15.7C, a new record for December. This wasn't because it was sunny, in fact it was a dull, damp day, but rather it was a result of warm air being whisked up from the Azores under a powerful jet stream. At the same time Storm Bram was developing off Newfoundland and that too moved quickly across the Atlantic, arriving here on the 9th and causing flooding in several parts of the UK.

The wettest day of the month here was the 15th, as a cooler North Atlantic airmass pushed into the west of the UK bringing hours of persistent steady rain. By the end of the day we had recorded 23.0mm – that wouldn't be remarkable in upland areas, but for Brent Knoll it's a lot. The following day we were back in tropical air, this time from a more southerly direction and the 18th was another wet day with 20.0mm of rain; by now the rhynes were filling up, something we hadn't seen for quite a while.

On the 21st the weather pattern changed, with high pressure moving to our north, then covering the whole of the UK as Christmas approached. With low pressure to our south, we found ourselves in a cold easterly wind, but it put a stop to the rain and brought sunshine for the bracing Christmas Day walk. Towards the end of the month the high pressure moved out into the Atlantic, while a low developed over Scandinavia. This was a mirror image of the position for the first three weeks of the month – with high pressure to our west and low to the east, we were in a cold, dry Polar airflow. New Year's Eve started bright and sunny, but as mist drifted in during the afternoon the thermometer dropped below zero and that evening we recorded the lowest temperature of the month at -4.1C.

Rainfall for December came to 136.0mm (Cheddar reservoir is full) and the average temperature was 8.1C – well above average, but several recent Decembers have been warmer.

This has been an eventful year weather-wise, starting with a particularly wet January. February's rainfall was about average, but in March we recorded only 9.8mm. Spring 2025 was the second driest I have recorded (78.8mm) and summer was the driest by quite a margin (72.0mm). The Knoll went very brown, but I'm still not convinced it was as brown as it was in 1976.

Both spring (11.7C) and summer (18.6C) 2025 were the warmest I have recorded, with several notably hot spells. From 2008 to 2019 I recorded a temperature of 30C or more on 13 days, an average of just over one day per year. In summer 2021 I recorded 30C or more on five days. In 2022 it was eight days, in 2023 one day and in summer 2024 we only got to 29.9C. In summer 2025 I recorded 30C or more on 10 days. It isn't just us; hot dry weather meant that forest fires in Canada started early and the smoke could be seen here as it passed overhead in the jet stream. This was soon followed by smoke from fires in northern Spain. North Atlantic sea surface temperatures were 1.5C above the long-term average during the summer.

Finally, it won't be a surprise to know that 2025 was the warmest year I have recorded at 12.4C (my average figure is 11.2C). The rainfall total for the year was about what we would expect at 716.4mm, but less than a quarter of that fell during the spring and summer – January, November and December all topped 100mm. It's been quite a year.
