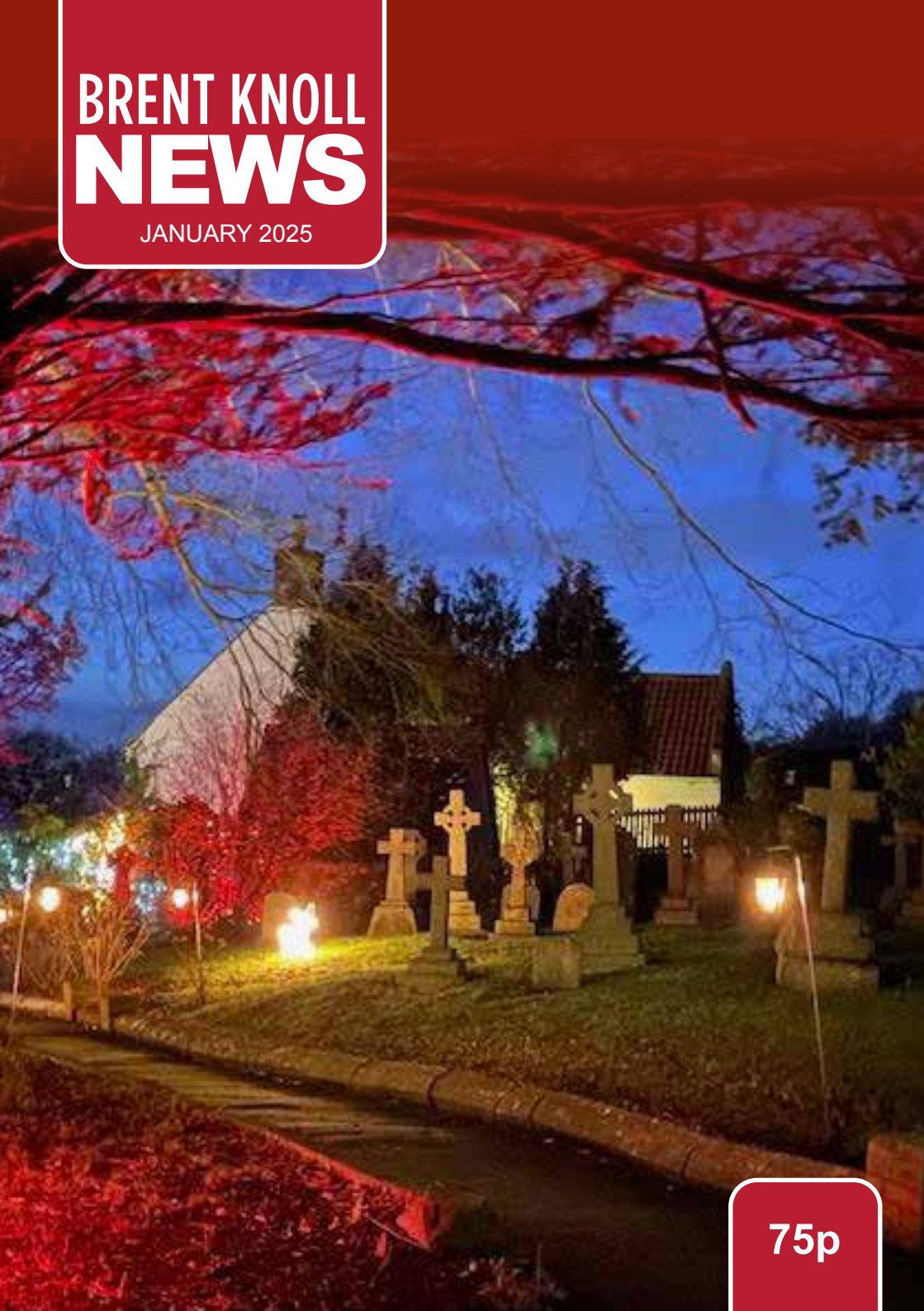

Brent Knoll's Community Shop News

The shop had a very busy and successful Christmas. One of the highlights for us was the sale of "Deepest Somerset" books. More than twenty were sold, with the shop benefiting by £5 for each sale, while one customer bought four copies as Xmas gifts.

Two of our volunteers, Ade Povey and Steve Wilcox, are to be thanked for turning out in the dark before 6am to take delivery of our customers' Christmas meat orders on 23rd December.

We've also benefited from more volunteers joining our team, which now numbers 35 active participants, with a number of former volunteers hoping to re-join us. Our shop is entirely run and "staffed" by volunteers, so we hope that others in the village will take the decision to volunteer in the New Year.

We're gaining a reputation for stocking really interesting cheeses. The latest additions to our stock include Cheddar with blackcurrant and Mexican Cheddar. Come along to our next "Sausage Sizzler" on Saturday 31st January (10am to 12 noon), when we'll stage a cheese-tasting.

Meanwhile, a recent meeting with the Parish Council and the new shop's architect heard him recommend that we install an awning to combat the rain in-flow that has damaged our door mat – and would also help the summer-time issue of the sun glare, which our investment in special window film has not totally resolved. This will require planning permission and Parish Council consent, but we are exploring prices.

We now have statistical proof that our new shop benefits enormously from events on the Village green and in the Parish Hall, like the monthly Farmers' Market and Bazaar. We've come a long way since opening as an "Emergency Shop" in the old village shop at the start of the first Covid lock-down in April 2020!.

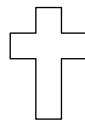

Let it Snow!

Snow can sometimes be seen in January and of course it is loved by children. But it has its problems particularly for wildlife who not only find it difficult to stay warm but to find food as well. Heavy snow and subzero temperatures mean that we will see casualties unable to find their food and these can be ones that we rarely see. Lapwings that usually come to this country in the Winter are unable to cope with snow and others needing food from rhynes, rivers or streams like Egrets, Crested Grebes and Water rails will be brought in. The one animal that seems to still cope very well is the fox who can hear the voles under the snow as well as being very good at finding food. We humans have often put food out for them, or they make the most of visiting bins and fast-food vendors in towns and cities.



Badgers will probably stay snug in their setts. They don't hibernate but having put on extra fat in the Autumn making the most of the fruits from hedgerows, they can sleep away the really cold weather. The deep sleep is most important for the females. Badgers have delayed implantation which means that they can mate at any time of the year, but it is while they sleep that the embryos attached themselves to the womb and start to grow. The gestation is 7 weeks and even when born, cubs will stay underground for the first eight to ten

weeks of their lives.

For us at Secret World, we are lucky that some of our staff and volunteers that live nearby will come in to help out, as travel can sometimes be almost impossible for those living a distance away. Now that we have a warm treatment centre, it means that we can cope with the frozen locks, water pipes and cleaning outside pens if we can go in for a coffee or tea and a warmup. There's even time for a snowball fight once the work is done!



This is the time when you can help by making sure that a dish of water is out for the birds and putting food out means that you may see some of the more unusual birds coming in. The snow makes the whole world look beautiful from inside a warm home, but we are eventually quite happy to see it go!.

Brent Knoll House Histories – 104

Notably, William Spearing states in his will that, “the Churchwardens and Overseers of the parish of Axbridge...shall yearly and in every year upon Tuesday in the Easter week passe a true just and perfect account of the rents Issues and profits of the said tenement, lands and premises received and taken by them to the Mayor Alderman and Capital Burgesses of Axbridge.” One suspects that he was not totally convinced that they would handle the estate properly otherwise. In fact, a little later in his will he enjoins the Mayor and Council “to see the rents and profits...be faithfully Employed according to the true intention and meaning of this my will.” (he may have been correct in his assumption, as we shall see).

He also stated that “any overplus, should be divided into three equal parts and distributed “amongst poore householders ...who, notwithstanding their honest labours and endeavours, God is pleased to reduce under some degree of necessity and want.” One part thereof should be at “the Feast of the birth of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ,” another third at “the resurrection of our Lord, commonly known as Easter” and the third part at Whit Sunday. Each of these was a public holiday at that time and Whit Sunday, in particular, had a traditional custom for children to receive a new set of clothes, even amongst the poorest families, so his benevolence would have been particularly welcome to them at that time.

So far I have found little relating to how the charity was conducted during its first century or so, but there is an interesting court case in Chancery between the Attorney General and the Axbridge Corporation in 1792, in which George Symons, Richard Cox and John Crease, all Inferior Burgesses, accuse the late Mayor, John Tucker, of causing a loss of income amounting to £50 (quite a lot of money then, going into multiple thousands of pounds, though differing sites quote very different comparisons). This would, of course, be of considerable detriment to the poor of the parish.

Before looking at the details of that case, however, it is interesting to see a document, produced the following year, which shows the receipts and disbursements of the charity. The document (shown left) is divided into two, with the upper

section showing the value obtained from “The Estate in the Ocipesen (occupation) of Mrs Hutchens, Lying in the Parishes of South Brent, Est Brent and Mark belonging to the Poor of

Axbridge”.

Brent Knoll House Histories – Continued

This comprises a house, garden and two closes going by Estimation: 12 acres, yielding £24..0s..0d, 9 acres, yielding £16..4s..0d (£16.20p), a plot known as Zier (the following names were mentioned in one of the earlier editions of this article) yielding £5..5s..0d (£5.25p), Great Zier 1 acre, yielding £1..7s..0 (£1.35p), Bowls ½ acre, yielding 13s..6d (67½p), three lotments (allotments, I assume) in Mark Moor, yielding £6..0s..0d and two acres and a half of arable, yielding £2..5s..6d (£2.27½p), which gave a yearly value of £55..15s..0d (£55.75p).

From that there are some deductions due to the disbursements of the Council regarding maintenance on that specific estate. These are also detailed, comprising the following:

Church and Poor rates to South Brent "2..4s..0 (£2.20p), the same to East Brent, 10s 6d (52½p), and to Mark, 6s..10d (c34½p), fences to the Home ground, comprising 150 ropes of the whole of Ditch at 2d per rope, £1..5s..0d (£1 25p), half fence to the same ground at 5s..0d (25p), another half fence to the nine acres comprising 100 ropes which appear to be at 2d per rope, but the total suggests these ones cost 2.8d per rope, or there were 40 more

ropes used, it is a little difficult to interpret this figure. Zier definitely had 40 ropes, but these were obviously not of such good quality as they only cost 1½d per rope and 20 others were only ¾d per rope. This meant they only cost 6s..3d (c32½p) and the 18 Bowls ropes and 44 Balls field ropes were also at 1½d per rope costing 2s..3d (c11p) and 5s..6d (27½p) respectively. So, it seems that there was a lot of rope fencing required that year and of course, some gates needing repairing as well. This cost £1..5s..0d (£1.25p), though it does say "&c", so other smaller costs may be included.

Finally, a couple of items regarding repairs to Abbots Causeway and Gates on Pilrow Wall in Mark, costing 5s..0d (25p) and repairing the house £1, which is presumably the house in which Mrs Hutchins resides. The reference to Abbots Causeway and Pilrow Wall is interesting as the road through Mark today is marked on maps as Mark Causeway, but the White Horse Inn does refer to itself as being on Abbots Causeway and Pilrow Wall is linked to the Pilrow Wall Rhyne which flows past the White Horse Inn on the opposite side of the road. I am not sure why the Axbridge poor estate is managing this area as my understanding is that South Brent, East Brent and Lympham were responsible for its maintenance, as it was their route to Glastonbury to pay rentals at one time.

Bishop's letter - Time to learn to pray

'Lord, teach us to pray.' In Luke's Gospel it's these words, spoken by the disciples, that cause Jesus to give them the Lord's Prayer (Luke 11:1-4). Jesus says to his friends 'When you pray say: Father, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come. Give us each our daily bread. And forgive us our sins, for we ourselves forgive everyone indebted to us. And do not bring us to the time of trial.'

Many of us think that we should be able to pray automatically, and that if we can't, it's either because 'it's not our thing' or because we're failing. Yet in Luke's Gospel, the disciples still need to ask Jesus how to pray, even after they've been knocking around with him for ages. So maybe we should give ourselves a break and accept that working out how to pray is not obvious and that all of us need to learn.

In 2026, I'm asking all of us across our diocese of Bath and Wells to make the year one of especial focus on prayer. I'm hoping we'll all be able to say the words 'Lord teach us to pray' and that together we'll all grow in our experience, understanding, insight and practice.

How can we learn about prayer? We have to make a start. We need to make some mistakes. We need to learn from others. It doesn't happen in the abstract. Prayer is a 'learning by doing thing' where if we stick at it, we grow and change.

How might you learn to pray more this year? There isn't a master plan designed to get everyone on their knees. Most action will happen locally where we can identify what we need, work out who can help us and then get underway. Some simple resources designed to be helpful are being made available. More importantly, please do talk to your vicar or other church leaders about what might be possible where you are.

Together, let's say these words in the year that is to come: 'Lord, teach us to pray.' A very happy New Year to you all.

Church Clock

On Tuesday 9th December Cumbria Clock came to carry out the routine maintenance of the Church clock which was OK. I told the Engineer of the concern that has become apparent.

He took photographs using binoculars and camera to get as much detail as possible from the Churchyard. He then examined from the Ringing room as much as possible, as the new Clock backing plate restricts this. He could not ascertain whether it was fungal, algal or dust that was coating the Gilding.

The South-west face of the tower and clock both face south west where it receives the full blast of the prevailing weather, along with trees being close.

The engineer will report back to the Head office in Penrith, who will be in touch with the Church office and this will be relayed to Brent Knoll News.

March 16th

Statement was made by the owner of a 16 roomed farmhouse in Brent Knoll that he had made arrangements for it to be pulled down on account of its condition, when the Weston blitz occurred and he let it to a number of people from that town.

George Hill, farmer, of East Brent applied for recovery of possession of Lake House Cottage, which was let to Stanely Wilfred Hancock.

The 16 roomed house with an acre of land had been let 2 years ago on a lease of £2 per week and there were 3 persons living there. Mr Hancock was working in the building trade.

Edwin Miller and Joseph Edward Cropper mentioned.

The RDC have approved plans for 4 additional houses on a site already acquired.

April 13th

Late Mr H.G.J. Meldrum

Major Meldrum resided in Brent Knoll for 16 years. He was secretary of the Bowling Club and a member of the Church Council.

He founded the Brent Knoll Branch of the British Legion and was for some time secretary of the RAOB at Brent Knoll.

He died at Sycamore House, Church Street, Highbridge aged 80.

He saw active service in the 1914-18 war, retiring with the rank of Major. He was an officer in the Home Guard during the 1939-45 war.

Mrs Evelyn Clara Holloway aged 79 was found dead by her sister at her home, Knoll Cottage.

Nature Diary January – Bits and bobs

In December I looked back over the year and highlighted some significant issues arising from a very dry and hot summer. This New Year Diary amplifies some of these thoughts and is based on observations during November. Regular readers will recognise an obsession I have with bird feeders, so please excuse my returning to the subject. Ash dieback is in my thoughts as we plan to have a major tree in the churchyard pollarded in January. Finally, the consequences of a very dry year are still with us, so I shall return briefly to this theme.

Bird feeders – Every year that I put out my bird feeder I determine not to provide food for those that don't deserve it. By this I mean the squirrels, jackdaws, seagulls and wood pigeons who pinch all the food that I have put out for the tits, finches and other interesting small(er) birds. I am careful to place the feeder away from the blackthorn tree so that the squirrel won't be able to leap directly onto the feeder. This, of course, is useless because they simply shin up the pole and stretch themselves out as they devour the fat ball or peanuts, whatever takes their fancy. But, squirrels need to feed and they are well worth observing as they do so. This year has been good for seeds and fruit and I have watched our squirrel eating the sloes on the blackthorn. With a pair of binoculars I can see the whole performance, sloe held carefully between the paws, the nibbling action of the incisors and the quiver of both cheeks as it is consumed. The other observation about their feeding habits is that they don't consume much food at a single visit, so their visits to the fat ball are short lived. They eat little and often, which is why the fat ball disappears so quickly. However, they are not the only visitors to eat the fat ball. Jackdaws arrive in small flocks of about half a dozen and find it very simple to reach through the container and peck away.

So, despite the "unfair" advantage that squirrels and jackdaws have over the small birds, their eating habits provide some interesting wildlife observations.

Ash dieback and pollarding - The difficulty that I have with Ash trees is working out whether they are dying through Ash dieback or, more simply, old age. The large tree near the churchyard gate onto the Knoll footpath suddenly shed branches in May. My immediate thought was that it was diseased and that emergency action was needed. Our tree surgeon and local wildlife experts disagreed. The tree was old and dying, and it either needed complete removal or severe pollarding. Because of its situation and cost considerations the church has decided on the latter course of action. The work will take place on **Monday 26th January**, and the reason that I am being precise about this is that the footpath around the east end of the church will be closed for the day. **Walkers will be able to use the footpath up the Knoll by an alternative route through the west churchyard.** The work will create a considerable pile of ash logs that will be stored by the gate onto the footpath. Please feel free to collect a log or two. **There will be no charge but a donation to church funds would be much appreciated.**

Finally, the dry conditions and springs – despite the rain in November the usual spring at the bottom of the church steps has yet to appear. Other springs along Church and Hill Lanes are now leaking water into the roadway. I am sure that the New Year will see the reappearance of our church spring, but it does make you realise how important it used to be for springs to produce water. Nowadays we take our water supply for granted. It was not always so. Ged

Brent Knoll Weather Report – November 2025

November was a warm and wet month, helping to keep heating bills down and fill reservoirs up, but like October before it there was a distinct lack of sunshine. The month fell neatly into two halves, with cloudy but very mild conditions up to the 15th, and more typical November weather thereafter. The switch between the two halves began with Storm Claudia, which produced getting on for half the month's rainfall on the 13th and 14th.

The first week of November produced some remarkable temperatures for the time of year. A large area of high pressure moved into Europe from the Azores at the beginning of the month and by the 3rd it extended from Portugal to the Balkans. At the same time ex-hurricane Melissa was moving across the Atlantic on a track which took it between Scotland and Iceland. Although Melissa was no longer a hurricane (the North Atlantic isn't warm enough for that), this low still packed quite a punch and drew a mass of warm and humid tropical air over the UK.

The humidity meant cloud, although there were a few sunny spells, but the main feature was the warmth. Overnight on the 3rd/4th and 4th/5th the minimum temperatures were over 14C (a normal figure would be about 7C), while the daytime maximum was around 16C – only a 2C variation between night and day. On the 5th we recorded a maximum of 17.2C, and the 6th saw the highest temperature of the month at 18.1C – this is way above normal for November. During this time the cloud generated a few showers, but it was dry for Burnham Carnival and Bonfire Night.

Melissa moved away north-east on the 7th and at the same time the high over Europe moved further east, so for the second week of November the airflow was more southerly and still unusually mild. On the 10th a developing low crossed the Atlantic, deepening as it went, and it took up a position to the west of the Bay of Biscay on the 12th, its progress blocked by high pressure to the east. This was Claudia, named by the Spanish weather service because of its potential to bring heavy rain to Iberia.

At the same time an area of high pressure moved east from Greenland, so that by the 13th we were in the reverse of the position we had been in since the start of the month – high pressure to our north-west and Claudia to the south. The result was Polar air moving down across the UK, where it met the warm humid air from the south. At the boundary between these two air masses it rained – and rained and rained. The Midlands and Wales were most affected, with flooding in places, but here we recorded around 50mm of rain in 24 hours on the 13th/14th.

The Polar air brought a very different feel to the weather – it was colder, of course, but also fresher in the dry air, with more sunshine by day and the first overnight frosts of the month. The Mendips got a sprinkling of snow early on the 19th, with much heavier snowfall in the north of the UK.

On the 22nd an Atlantic low moved slowly across the UK bringing wind and showers on milder Atlantic air. This was followed by a brief spell of high pressure and a clear sunny day on the 25th, with the temperature dropping to -2.7C under a clear sky the following night. The end of the month brought more Atlantic lows with cloud and showers on more mild mid-Atlantic air.

Rainfall for November came to a wet 118.0mm and thanks to that long mild spell the average temperature was also well above normal at 10.0C. It was a dull month, but not a windy one.

The average temperature for autumn 2025 was 12.6C, about half a degree above normal but nothing exceptional. Rainfall came to 271.4mm, about 50mm above average and no doubt making a useful contribution to Bristol Water's reserves after the dry spring and summer. Talking of which, I see that Blagdon and Chew Valley are still rather low for this time of year (58%), but Cheddar is up to 79% which is a big improvement.
