

Brent Knoll's Community Shop News

Somerset's growing number of Community Shops, set up by volunteers to replace closed commercial shops, are now joining forces to share ideas and experience.

Sixteen representatives of eleven Community Shops held their third meeting last month (October) in Brent Knoll, hosted by Brent Knoll Community Shop, which opened as an "Emergency Shop" at the height of the Covid crisis almost six years ago, after the closure of our village shop and Post Office.

The newly formed Somerset Community Shops Group already has members from Hinton St George, Westbury-sub-Mendip, Oake, Norton sub-Hamden, Seavington, Draycott, Stogumber, Winsham, Kingsbury Episcopi, Crowcombe, Bicknoller, Brent Knoll and Roadwater. Other Community Shops in the county are now being urged to join the new group.

The Brent Knoll meeting was also attended by a senior representative from the Plunkett Foundation, the national charity that has supported more than 350 community shops and helped them to achieve a much higher survival rate than the average for new business ventures.

Topics addressed at the meeting included marketing, social media, profitability, recruiting and retaining volunteers and the required policies and procedures.

All member shops are now in email contact for sharing information or requesting advice and will meet again after Christmas, while Plunkett is helping them to contact the other Community Shops in Somerset.

While October saw our shop enter the Halloween spirit with locally grown pumpkins, a "guess the weight" contest and a host of spooky treats, the focus now is on the approach of Christmas. This year, we'll be hosting a Christmas Card Post Box for the Scouts, who will deliver your local cards.

As usual, we'll also have order-forms for all your locally sourced Christmas meats, and set up our gazebo on the village green for you to collect your orders.

Meanwhile, we'll be holding our next "Sausage Sizzler" at the Parish Hall from 10am to 12 noon of Saturday 29th November.



Polecats - Mustela putorius.

We have always had members of the Mustelidae family - otter, badger, stoat and weasel, coming in to us as adults and juveniles. Now we are starting to see Polecats as casualties, but it's not always



easy to identify them from an escaped ferret (although their behaviour is a good indicator).

The Polecat is starting to increase naturally from Wales after practically being exterminated by 1915 because of their fur which was valued for warm clothes and persecution by gamekeepers. Mustela tells you they are one of the families that rely heavily on the sense of smell as a recognition and repellent aid. Putorius means 'stink' and they certainly do, especially when frightened by emitting the smell from the two scent glands next to their tail!

Looking very similar to a ferret or mink, its brown fur covers most of the body, but the face has a facial mask which joins the nose. They were found all over England until persecution left just a few remaining animals in Wales. However, the success story means that they have now increased from approximately 5,000 to 46,000 in the current time. Polecats live happily in farmland, hedgerows and small woods. In the summer they will frequent rabbit burrows giving them accommodation and a supply of food. Their long slim body means they can hunt easily through the tunnels.

In the Middle Ages, polecats would be captured and trained to hunt out rabbits and birds for falconers. Even prior to this age, it is detailed that the Romans also used polecats for hunting. Polecats were very welcome by farmers as rats and mice are part of their diet and they would control these naturally. We had a tame polecat for several years when someone raised a small kit thinking it was a mink, so had planned to keep it in captivity. It therefore became very tame.

Maurice the polecat doesn't have the same ring as Maurice the mink! He was with us for several years and was cared for by Stuart, one of our volunteers.

It's mainly orphan polecats that we get in and these, like stoats and weasels, take meat when they are only three weeks old. They are two to three months old before they are independent and will have turned wild, very capable of spitting and biting by then. This is why it was so unusual to have a tame polecat like Maurice. It's a success story to see these mammals increasing and living in the surroundings where they belong. Being mainly nocturnal, secretive and solitary, they are rarely seen.

Pine Martins have been seen historically in Scotland but with introduction programmes in Devon, Cumbria and now the Forest of Dean, means we will probably start to see them as they spread. The reason that they are being introduced is because they do belong in our countryside, having been made extinct in certain areas due to human persecution. However, they are also an animal that predates the grey squirrel which is another reason why they have been brought back to new areas. With a diet of nestlings and eggs, there is also a balance that needs to be seen to ensure that these introductions do not have an unwanted risk to other wildlife that frequents their territories.

Two enchanting mustelids that we shall see more often.



Brent Knoll House Histories – 102


William Spearinge, who was mentioned last month as the person who acquired the local properties, was born in Brent Knoll, but moved to Axbridge and became a burgess of that town. Unfortunately, the Register of births in this village does not start until 1678, so I do not have an exact date of birth for him, but it is probable that he moved to Axbridge due to marrying a girl from there. There is a marriage recorded in 1643 between a William Sperring

and Agnes Jeffery on the 18th May and it is that year in which William becomes an Inferior, or Free (libi) Burgess of Axbridge as shown here.

There were two levels of Burgesses in Axbridge, the Inferior, or Free, Burgesses and the Superior, or Capital, Burgesses. There were normally



only nine Capital Burgesses, but rather more Inferior Burgesses, though their number varied at differing times. Unsurprisingly, the Capital Burgesses had the major power, including acting as the Mayor and Alderman at various times, whilst the Inferior Burgesses tended to do the dirty work, amongst which would be acting as Constables, Bailiff, Bread Weighers, Ale Tasters, Leather Wardens, Shambles Wardens, Moor Wardens and Street Wardens. William is recorded as a Constable in 1644 and as the Bailiff in 1645, but shortly after becomes a Capital Burgess and, as regularly happened at that time, a new Capital Burgess would become Mayor during the following Convocational year. Which, in his case, stretched from September 21st



1649 to the 20th of September 1650. In this picture he is recorded as "Maiore."

Also following tradition, the next year was the one where he would become

the Alderman of Axbridge. If no new Capital Burgess was appointed during a year the other Capital Burgesses took it in turn to hold those senior positions and, as a Capital Burgess remained in that post for his lifetime, unless he moved away from Axbridge, offered his resignation or was caught in some misdemeanour, that meant that some Capital Burgesses held those offices a number of times. In William Spearinge's case he was Mayor four times and, of course, Alderman four times. His second term was shortly after his first, in 1656-7 and 1657-8 respectively, whilst the third and fourth terms were in 1669-70, 1670-1 and in 1679-8, 1680-1.

Interestingly, he made his will in 1688, two years before he died, which suggests he may have been suffering from illness or age at that time, although it would seem likely that he was close to having a fifth term around then.

Mind you, it was a rather tempestuous time that he lived through. When he became an Inferior Burgess Charles the First was still on the throne, but the first Civil War was underway. His first term as a Capital Burgess and Mayor happened during the second Civil War period. His second term was during the Commonwealth, his third and final terms were under Charles

the second and he then survived during the reign of James the second and the Monmouth Rebellion, wrote his will about the same time as the "Glorious Revolution" and finally died in the reign of William and Mary.

In Axbridge church there is a monument to William Spearing, stating that he was mayor four times and noting his age as the 74th year of his life. Which means he was born in the reign of James the first.

In his will, William Spearing leaves "all that messuage or tenement and the several lands, meadows, pastures and hereditaments thereunto belonging, situate in South Brent and East Brent in the County of Somerset, containing by



estimation 30 acres", to two of his friends who were also Capital Burgesses: Thomas Lovell, senior, and John Tuthill, senior. Notably both are referred to as 'senior,' which means that they have sons with similar names, who are also living in Axbridge. They, however, held the lands "upon trust that they should permit and suffer the churchwardens and overseers of the poor of the said parish of Axbridge....to let and dispose thereof to the best advantage, so that the rents and profits thereof might be employed and disposed of for the benefit of the poor of Axbridge, and for such other purposes as were thereafter expressed, viz. that 4s (20p) should be weekly laid out in sixpenny loaves of bread by the churchwardens and overseers of the poor....or in any other way which might be most advantageous for the poor, which said loaves of bread upon every Sunday morning yearly before morning service and sermon should be brought into the parish church of Axbridge, and decently placed in some convenient place made for that purpose only and after the morning service and sermon the said loaves of breads should be every Sunday distributed and given by the churchwardens and overseers of the poor....as should come usually to the said parish church to hear divine service and sermon." William did not use the term, 'second poor,' but made it clear that the distribution of the loaves of bread "should prefer and principally respect poor housekeepers...who should receive no relief by the public rates," which is a reasonable description of the second poor.

He also required 10s (50p) of the income from those estates to be used for paying the local minister to preach a sermon on Good Friday in the morning. Next month I will conclude the terms of the will and look at how his charity continues to be used today.



This year we have seen the addition of the Zip-Wire as requested by the local children, when the Parish Council worked with the village school to ask what extra play





Nature Diary November - Lichens

In 2018 a lichen expert from Scotland contacted me to say that there was a rare lichen growing on the north aisle wall of St Michael's Church. He was keen to revisit the church to check whether it was still there. Unfortunately, he was unable to visit again personally but he promised to put us in touch with a local lichenologist who would take a further look at the church and the churchyard. Time went by, Covid-19 lockdown 1 intervened and the lichenologists finally arrived at St Michael's on August 5th, 2020, to do their survey of the church and the churchyard.

The study of lichens is a highly specialized subject and we were looking forward to seeing them at work and learning from their expertise. Unfortunately, we had a slow start because early morning cloud had turned to a steady drizzle and we discovered that this can cause problems for identification because lichens look different when they are wet. Nothing daunted the team got to work and began to examine the walls in minute detail with illuminated magnifiers. Most of the time recognition was instant but when it wasn't various chemicals were dropped onto the lichens to see what colour they produced. If this didn't work the next stage was to take a very small quantity and put it in a test tube for later examination under a microscope. Over 80 species were recorded.

So, what did we learn on the day? The first thing is that lichens are made up of two types of living organism, a fungus and an alga. The relationship between the fungus and the alga is a type of symbiosis (= the living together of unrelated organisms) for the benefit of both organisms. The alga provides food for the fungus partner and in return the fungus provides the algal partner with protection and somewhere to live. Algae are plants and fungi are neither plant nor animal, being quite different from animals and plants. Overall, there are about 1800 species of lichen in Britain so our churchyard population covers roughly 5% of all species known in Britain. When they are named scientifically (remember the binomial system developed in the 18th by Linnaeus – see May 2025 BKN) their names take that of the fungus. Fungi of lichens are extremely diverse having evolved from many unrelated non-lichen fungi. Most lichen fungi are cup fungi (Ascomycetes) but there are a few toadstools (Basidiomycetes). There are far fewer species of algae in lichens, perhaps only a few hundred. The algae belong to some very different groups. Most lichens contain a green alga but from groups of green algae that are not closely related. About 10% of lichens species contain photosynthetic bacteria (cyanobacteria = blue-green algae). The type of alga is associated with the ecology and geographical distribution of the lichen.

Lichens are very hardy and can survive in very hostile environments. Many people will be familiar with the yellow colour that rocks have at the tideline on a rocky shore. This is due to a lichen and the colour protects the species of algal cells which occur in these lichens from strong sunlight. They can survive regular wetting and drying and a wide temperature variation twice a day. Looking at our church and churchyard lichens you can see that the stonework of the church and the gravestones are covered with lichens of various colours. Many of these are surviving in direct sunlight but there is a clear preference for them some of them to grow on the north side of the church where temperature variation is less and the atmosphere is more moist.

Lichens are of three broad types, crusty (hugs the stone), leafy (raised and like a leaf) and shrubby (like a small bush). They can be confused with mosses and liverworts. Mosses and most liverworts have very small but individual leaves on a stem and are mostly a grass-green colour. Liverworts do not have leaves but have spreading lobes which are green on top and underneath. Very few lichens have a grass-green colour and those that do have a different colour (usually white) underneath.

Brent Knoll Feature – 58

Although I did mention much of what follows in October 2024, I think it is important to repeat it, because on the first of November 1875 a rather important event occurred in Brent Knoll. This year is the one hundred and fiftieth anniversary of that event and, although the eventual outcome has proven to be less attractive, it should definitely be remembered, as it had a major impact on this village. I am, of course, referring to the opening of the railway station in the village. There had been a railway line running through the village since 1841, when part of the line, from Bristol to Bridgwater, was opened in June of that year. By 1844 the opening of the remainder of the route to Exeter was celebrated, but nothing stopped at South Brent, as our village was known then.



Shortly after that, between 1846 and 1849, the South Devon Railway was opened and as a part of that, a station was opened in another South Brent, near Dartmoor, in 1848. It was a policy of the railways not to repeat the name of a station, so when eventually a station was built here, it could not be called South Brent station. An obvious replacement name was the name of the hill which the village lies beneath. So, our station became Brent Knoll station and the following year, the Bristol & Exeter amalgamated with the GWR.

For some time, people still continued to use the original name for our village, but it became increasingly obvious that others were using the name of the station instead. Finally, on the 8th of June 1883 the Local Government Board issued an order officially altering the name from South Brent to Brent Knoll.

Unfortunately, only one train each way per day ran for many years and the station was closed permanently in 1971, just four years before its centenary. Nothing exists today except, of course, for the fact that the village is still known as Brent Knoll, rather than South Brent, and that the brick-built stationmasters house still remains.

Nature Diary November - Continued

As mentioned before lichens can survive complete drying out which enables them to thrive on exposed surfaces. They obtain water from rain and by absorbing water from humid air. Lichens which contain cyanobacteria need liquid water from rain but lichens with green algae can absorb some moisture from the air. One particular alga (Trentepohlia), which occurs in several lichens is very efficient at doing this and can be seen in St Michael's churchyard.

Lichens reproduce in one of two ways; first, the fungus produces microscopic fungus spores which float away to a new location where they germinate and, if a suitable alga is present, form a new individual and second, by forming small particles known as soredia that contain both fungus and alga. These are larger than spores and can distribute the lichen widely.

Lichens are known for their sensitivity to pollution. In the second half of the 20th century, lichens were decimated in urban areas by sulphur dioxide pollution. This pollution has since been reduced to low levels and lichens have returned to our cities. Now we have discovered that lichens are being seriously affected by nitrogen pollution from traffic and agriculture. Nitrogen pollution is of international concern since we are putting so much nitrogen into the soil for crops it is causing a massive imbalance to the earth's environment.

If you would like to learn more about lichens you can visit St Michael's churchyard where you can study the lichens on the church walls and gravestones. We have set up a comprehensive lichen trail that starts at the west door of the church. This can be accessed through our website using the QR code on the trail marker. Alternatively, there is a Simple Lichen Facts guide that can be downloaded through a QR code on the St Michael's Information desk in the North aisle.

PS the rare shrubby lichen on the North wall of the church is thriving!

Brent Knoll Weather Report – September 2025

After a hot and dry summer, September's weather probably came as a welcome change for many people. Temperatures throughout the month were refreshingly normal and, perhaps more importantly, the rain which began during the last few days of August continued until the 17th of September. The ground was warm, and three weeks or so of regular rainfall was enough to get the grass growing again. By the end of September the Knoll was looking quite green.

The rain was brought to us by the procession of Atlantic lows and these systems drew in air from within the Arctic Circle. This cold air became unstable as it passed first over a very warm Atlantic and then over the still-warm UK landmass. The result was towering Cumulus clouds (my favourite), occasionally heavy convective rain and thunderstorms on the 3rd, 7th and 8th.

Unfortunately, the wet weather continued over the Scarecrow weekend on the 13th and 14th. Saturday wasn't too bad, with sunny intervals and only an isolated shower during the afternoon, but Sunday was dull with persistent showers from lunchtime onwards. Even so, there were a few hardy souls walking through the village with soggy scorecard in hand. By the end of the day the rainfall total for September had surpassed that for the whole of the summer.

In the middle of the month a large area of high pressure developed to our south. This nudged the Atlantic lows onto a more northerly track, bringing our wet spell to an end. The rain wasn't far away, though; on the 20th a slow-moving front brought persistent rain in a line from Cornwall to Yorkshire, resulting in flooding and disruption. At the same time a developing low moved quickly up the Bristol Channel into the Midlands, resulting in gales here during the evening.

The 21st brought another change in the weather. A large area of high pressure over the Atlantic blocked the flow of lows from the west, while low pressure over the Baltic drew cold Polar air over the UK. The equinox on the 22nd was a day of unbroken sunshine, and around dawn on the 23rd the temperature dropped to 3.6C under a clear sky. There followed a series of cool but sunny days with just a few fair-weather Cumulus clouds; if you could escape the northerly breeze, it was pleasantly warm in the sunshine.

The high pressure moved slowly east across the UK and was over the Baltic by the 25th, allowing the Atlantic lows to return briefly. The 26th began sunny but cloud moved in at lunchtime and the 27th was overcast with rain during the evening and overnight. On the 28th a ridge of high pressure from the Azores brought a return to sunshine and blue sky, with a chilly 3.3C recorded during early morning fog on the 29th. The ridge stayed with us on the 30th to bring a sunny end to the month.

The average temperature for September was a very ordinary 14.9C with no extremes of heat or cold. The beginning and end of the month were sunny, the middle of the month less so – overall sunshine was about average.

I mentioned last month that the rainfall total for September 1976 was 181mm, breaking the long drought. This year we recorded half of that – a total of 90.6mm made this the third-wettest September I have recorded, but it was not enough to have any impact on reservoir levels. On 30th September Cheddar reservoir was at 27% of capacity, which is 1% less than the figure on 26th August (just before the rain started). One of the problems in 1976 was that the hot, dry summer followed a dry winter; despite the wet start to September, therefore, we need much more rain between now and next summer to rebuild our reserves.
